





- Supported GOs 'Double compensation' to be accounted for 'from the date of entry into force of RED II'
- No 'double compensation' is seen where:
 - Support results from tender or tradable green certificates
 - Market value of GO is taken into account when setting support level
 - GO are issued to suppliers/consumers through competitive sales or corporate PPAs
 - \circ GOs are issued and instantly cancelled

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Lobbying to correct errors/omissions



- Do all AIB members and Open Market Committee participants agree with the assessment of the latest draft?
- The Council is due to agree on RED II (only, not the full clean energy package) at the beginning of next year. Then the trialogue between Com, Council and EP will seek a compromise on the whole CEP by of 2018
- How can AIB and market parties help each other in this last leg of lobbying?

- RES en
- RES energy only Residual Mix still needed
 Compliance with CEN-EN 16325
 - CEN is for energy interference by other energy media
 - \circ Bureaucratic and slow
 - AIB will need to embed CEN into EECS; EECS has evolved since 2011
 - Derogation only permitted where there is an obstruction in the form of national legislation; others will be needed
- Scope of GO isn't fully regulated



- Minimum capacity for GOs
- GOs valid for calendar year plus 6 months

• Different shelf life for GOs

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Other Improvements



- GOs to record whether the energy met sustainability and GHG emissions savings criteria
- Renewable Gas (including hydrogen) to get a GO
- Single GO for HEC using RES

Additionality Labels



- 27th September CEPS event 'Does the EU renewables sector need a GO market?'
- Andre Poschmann of the German Ministry of Economic Affairs and Energy addressed the issue of how additionality might be assured in green electricity contracts
- Proposed the development and adoption of an EU Additionality Label for new plant
- Age of the plant is already on the GO, why is a label needed to restate this?
- Simply shifts the burden from state to individual would the state spend the money reclaimed from the consumer on more RES, doubtful

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- AIB prepared a paper for consideration by Poschmann
 - AIB already recognise voluntary sustainability schemes currently recognised by the EU Commission
 - AIB already supports the recording on GOs of Independent Criteria Schemes (ICSs) that the AIB has accredited for use in that country
 - The definition and verification of compliance with ecological or sustainability quality criteria is left with the qualified and authorised institution
 - AIB members are required to leave the information intact when importing/exporting GOs

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
